hances are, your religion has never told you that your name is already written in <u>The Book of Life</u>. God made provision for your salvation before the world was and Satan doesn't want you to know that your name is there.

All humanity has been **REDEEMED** "...with the precious blood of Christ...who verily was foreordained before the foundation of the world ..." (1 Peter 1:18-20). Eternal life is a **GIFT**! This is why you should repent, and "...lay apart all filthiness and superfluity of naughtiness, and **receive** with meekness the engrafted word, which is able to save your souls" (James 1:21).

God placed all of our names into a book, because, in due time, God sent His Son to rescue us from <u>the pen-alty of sin</u> (*which is death*).

When Moses pleaded before God for the sins of his people, he said to God, "Yet now, if thou wilt forgive their sin--; and if not, <u>blot me</u>, I pray thee, out of <u>thy</u> <u>book which thou hast written</u>." But God said to Moses, "Whosoever hath sinned against me, <u>him will I</u> <u>blot out of my book</u>" (Exodus 32:32-33).

To be "blotted out" means that our names are already written. God knows in the beginning who it will be that will believe on His name, and who will be blotted out of the Book of Life. But on the day of judgment, "...the books were opened: and another book was opened, which is <u>the book of life</u>...: and whosoever <u>was not</u> <u>found written</u> in <u>the book of life</u> was cast into the <u>lake</u> <u>of fire</u>" (Rev. 20:12,15).

Recently, the news reported that **Bernie Mac**, a comedian, and **Isaac Hayes**, a singer, have left this world in death. Did they repent to God before their passing, or one of those who "...believed not the truth, but had pleasure in unrighteousness" (**2 Thes. 2:12**)?

No one knows on this side of the grave, and God warns us to "...<u>iudge nothing before the time</u>, until the Lord come, who both will <u>bring to light the hidden things</u> <u>of darkness</u>, and will make manifest the counsels of



the hearts..." (1 Cor. 4:5). But what about you? Are you ready to die, or are you taking your chances? "It is bet-

ter to <u>trust in the Lord</u> than to put confidence in man" (**Psalm 118:8**), including yourself.

You must recognize that "all we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way" (Isaiah 53:6). If we'd be <u>honest</u> with our selves, we <u>KNOW</u> all the wrong we do when no one is around.
